EMERGENCY CARDS were sent home with the Parent Handbook. Please return them to the school next week. **A new card is required each year to insure updated information.** Students should return the cards to their homeroom teachers. **Be sure to indicate your area code, fill in both sides, and sign the card.** If there are any changes during the year, **please call and let us know.**

BUS PROBLEMS While we sympathize with your transportation and bus difficulties, we have no jurisdiction over routes, drivers or times. Call the bus company directly to lodge a complaint. If you do not receive satisfaction from the bus company, call your local school district transportation office. Your tax dollars pay for this service.

ABSENTEEISM If your child is going to be absent from school, please call the office and let us know. If we have not heard from you and there is no message on our voice mail, the school nurse will make every effort to contact you at home or work. Students are required to submit an absence note to their homeroom teacher upon their return to school.

PARENT PICKUPS If you plan to pick your child up from school rather than have him or her take the bus, please be sure to send a note to the office or call the office **early** in the day. At dismissal time, parents who pick their children up (either every day or occasionally), must sign out with Mrs. Eluto, Mrs. Richardson or Mrs. Williams. If we do not receive a phone call or note, we will put your child on the bus. We must have parental notification. Make sure that the office is advised of any changes in pickup arrangements that occur during the year. **Picking children up before regular dismissal time is permitted in emergencies only.** Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

MORNING DROP-OFFS Please be advised that the front circle is **exclusively for buses.** Please park in the parking lot, and **walk** your child across. Thank you for your cooperation.
